


June 5, 1864

The Confederates:

Major General Forrest is at Tupelo with two brigades of cavalry. After reading dispatches and telegrams, he is surprised by the general lack of information about the advancing Union troops in North Mississippi. Major General Stephen D Lee had ordered Colonel Rucker to move his troops from Oxford to New Albany before Forrest reached Tupelo. Forrest dispatches orders to Colonel Rucker by courier and telegraph, instructing him to deploy men behind the Union forces to capture couriers and train but keep the main body of his brigade on the Union right flank.

The Union:

The infantry and train began their march at 6:00 am and reached the cavalry camp on the east side of Salem by mid-morning. Camp was established, soldiers and horses were fed. At 4:00 pm, the cavalry breaks camp and rides 13 miles before stopping for the night at Dunbar's Mill.

Also, on the morning of the 5th, Colonel Karge of the 2nd New Jersey Cavalry led a patrol of 400 men to tap the telegraph at Rienzi, intercept messages, and then cut the wire to sever Confederate communications. Karge had orders to then move north to destroy all bridges and trestles as far north as the Tuscumbia River. If the river was unfordable, they were to seize and hold the bridge on the Danville-Corinth Road. However, if the river was passable, the patrol was to secure the crossing on the Kossuth-Corinth Road. Colonel Karge rode till past midnight, passing through Ripley at stopped at the L. B. Yancy farm three miles to the east.

Every day the Union troop column was delayed, gave Forrest another day to mass his cavalry.






Motorcycle Group Riding Positions
