

The Rankin Greys left before daylight in pouring rain, headed to Rolling Fork MS to cook for it's people and first responders. 2 trucks, pulling trailers loaded with food, tables, chairs, canopies, coolers of ice and bottled water. Cpl. Jerry Roden pulling "The Chuck Wagon" and Cpl. Jerry Dupre pulling the "Caboose". With Captain Billy Bryant, Lt. Bruce Warren, Sgt, Jeff Ainsworth, JJ Dafferner, and myself riding with them with Charles Smith joining us on site in his own vehicle. I for one wasn't ready for the devastation we saw when we got there. The images on the evening news don't do justice to the actual carnage. Rolling Fork looks like a war zone with huge trees down everywhere, vehicles upside down, twisted and mangled and buildings leveled to the foundation. Most people escaped there with literally the clothes on their backs!

We set up in the Southern Ag parking lot and went to work chopping onions, cutting up chicken, and sausage for a huge black pot of jambalaya. After about 3 hours of constant stirring the jambalaya was ready and I must say delicious. The brothers started making up to go boxes with jambalaya, a roll, and utensils. People immediately started pouring in getting to go boxes and bottled water. The police even came by and picked up 15 boxes for their on duty officers and staff. The turn out was so great that we soon emptied that huge pot. It was wonderful seeing so many people enjoying our food and so appreciative of our efforts. It made getting up in the middle of the night, leaving in a thunderstorm, and spending a Saturday working very worthwhile. All in all a great day and another chance to "Answer the Call" helping people in need.
