 - C. Ask Parents about their families
 - 1. Ask about grandparents & their children
 - 2. Get dates of birth, marriage, death
 If they can't tell you dates, asked where they lived, where they
 lived when they died. What they did for a living. All this will
 give you clues or where to look for answers
 - D. Look on line at familysearch.org
 - 1. Census records
 - 2. Civil war records
 - 3. Enumerated school children
 - 4. Some family trees
 - 5. Social Security Death Records
 - 6. Some information about early deaths from hospitals
- E. From Information collected of births and deaths
 - 1. If you know the state, and county, death year go to findagrave and see if can find the person.
 - 2. If you know the Cemetery and location of it use Cemetery finder on findagrave. Then type in last name of person.
- F. Now to the Court House
 - 1. Circuit Clerks office has: Marriage Records, Court Records,

Copies of Doctors licenses, etc.

2. Chancery Clerk's Office: Divorce Records, Civil Suits, Land Deeds, Wills.

G. Libraries

1. Get to know their Genealogy Rooms they have State, & County Records, Lists of Marriage Records, Census, Family Histories, Donated files from Genealogist. Talk to the person in charge of this department they will help you.
